

Dire l'heure

Vocabulaire: Dire l'Heure

Il est trois heures It's three o'clock (du matin)

3:00AM

.....

Il est midi It's noon

12:00PM

A. To ask the time in French, you will use the question: Quelle heure est-il?

To respond, you will begin with the phrase Il est followed by the hour:

Il est + y + heure(s). Example: Il est deux heures.

It's two o'clock.

B. Minutes past the hour until the half hour are added directly to the hour. The words quart and demie are joined by et.

Example: Il est quatre heures cinq.

It's five past four.

Example: Il est quatre heures et quart.

It's a quarter past four.

Minutes before the hour are expressed by the word moins. Moins le quart means a quarter to the hour.

Examples:

Il est six heures moins le quart. It's quarter to six.

Il est six heures moins vingt. It's twenty to six.

C. French uses the 24-hour clock (or "military time") for official purposes. In this system, et, moins, quart and demie are not used. Phrases such as du matin, de l'après-midi, du soir, which are French equivalents for A.M. and P.M. are also not used.

13:00h / 1pm

1) Il est treize heures/ Il est une heure de l'après-midi

It's one o'clock

14:00h / 2pm

2) Il est quatorze heures/ Il est deux heures

de l'après-midi. It's two o'clock

18:00 (6:00 P.M.)

Il est dix-huit heures

Il est six heures du soir

It's six o'clock

19:00 (7:00 P.M.)

Il est dix-neuf heures

Il est sept heures

du soir

It's seven o'clock

5:15 A.M.

Il est cinq heures quinze
Il est cinq heures et quart
It's five fifteen

5:30 A.M.

Il est cinq heures trente
Il est cinq heures et demie
It's five thirty

5:45 A.M.

Il est cinq heures quarante-cinq
Il est six heures moins le quart
It's five forty-five
It's a quarter to six
